



Call for Art: Framed Artwork for Rainier Tower

Tacoma General Hospital is expanding and renovating. Included in these improvements will be several new pieces of art. We are now looking for art for Tacoma General's new Rainier Tower.

Kimberly Kent Art Brokerage and the MMC Reinvestment Art Committee would like to extend this call to artists working for MultiCare.

Framed art is needed for the respite rooms, staff lounges and corridors. We are looking for paintings and other 2D artwork that focuses on the trees, flowers, water and natural environment. In the design of this new space a special focus is paid to images of Wright Park and Mt Rainier. The goal is to be uplifting and soothing to families experiencing difficult labor, delivery and post partum recovery, families with a newborn in the NICU and patients in adult medical and surgical units. The palette in these spaces uses a series of soft earth colors in both warm and cool. We are not accepting any photographs for this phase of the project.

As a guide, here are the selection criteria that have been established for artwork at MultiCare:

- Healing, pleasing, assuring and tasteful
- Expands variety and interest
- All paintings and other works of art must be original and the submitting artists must have all rights to the images.
- Pictures with humans will be considered only where humans are not recognizable.
- Materials and craftsmanship and framing must be of the highest quality.
- All submissions will be reviewed by the Rainier Art committee (consisting of staff, patients and family members) for final approval.

Submissions will be accepted for the Rainier Tower between July 1, 2013 and August 31, 2013.

Calls for art submissions for the subsequent Tacoma General (Rainier Pavilion, Olympic Pavilion) phases of improvements will be released soon. **Watch for them!**
